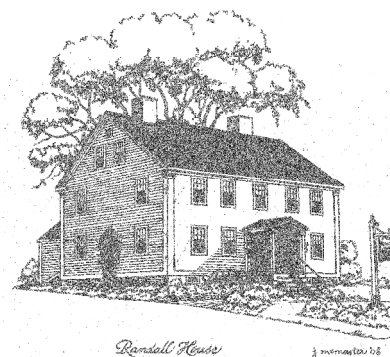

Fort Edward

Take Exit 6 from Hwy 101 on to Water St., take first left on to King St., take first left again on to Fort Edward St.

Built in 1750, ostensibly by Major Charles Lawrence, this is Canada's oldest remaining military structure and the last surviving blockhouse in Nova Scotia. Fort Edward was one of the main assembly points in the expulsion of the Acadians in 1755.

Built by shipbuilder William D. Lawrence, the house is one of the many fine homes built while Maitland was a shipbuilding center. To commemorate the launch of W.D. Lawrence's "Great Ship," a major Launch Day Festival is held in Maitland each year with a parade, historical skits, and the launching of a model of the huge vessel.

Dating back to the early 1890s, the building was used as a milk can fabrication facility and hardware store until 2000. It was then opened as museum. The museum features:

- A hardware store - with all its colorful 1920s clutter.
 - Tinsmith Shop - with all the original equipment intact from the 1890s.
 - Craft shop and gift store, staffed and stocked by local Nova Scotian artists.
- Additional exhibits - veterans memorial, clothing, household goods, farm tools.

Built circa 1815, the home of Richard John Uniacke, Attorney General of Nova Scotia, 1797 and 1830. A fine example of colonial architecture, this is a rare example of a house built in this era and never modernized. Visitors are invited to explore the 2300 acre estate using six newly developed hiking trails. (hiking boots are recommended)

At the Windsor Hockey Heritage Museum, the development of ice hockey from the 1800s to present is presented. Displays include wooden hockey pucks, early hockey nets and Acme Club Spring Skates that attached to a boot or shoe bottom.
